What are the minimum qualifications I need to join as a student member?

We accept student members once they have enrolled on a Level 2 or above course in a relevant canine subject.

What are the benefits of TCBTS Membership?

Do TCBTS members use welfare-centred dog training techniques?

Yes - all members of TCBTS and all ABTC registered practitioners have to conform to strict codes of practice to ensure the welfare of the animals we work with is maintained at all times.

What happens if I join mid-membership year?

Our membership year runs from 1st April to 31st March. If you join throughout the membership year, membership fees are pro rata until the next renewal date.

Assessments are held at various venues throughout the year. These are organised by our assessment team. Contact us and ask to be added to our mailing list and we can inform you when the next assessments will be taking place.

What is APEL?

APEL is Accreditation of Prior Experience and/or Learning and is suitable for those currently practising independently who do not have an ABTC recognised qualification but who wish to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding appropriate to the CAB standard, so they can progress to the CAB assessment of performance criteria. What is LIMA?

Lima, or 'Least Intrusive, Minimally Aversive' is a term used to summarise a training ethos which prioritise welfare and humane training, and ensures punitive methods are not used without extreme care and consideration.

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
